#### RECTOR'S RAMBLE



Have you ever noticed how some languages don't really suit the alphabets they use? Turkish was written in a modified Arabic script for 600 years until the Turkish alphabet reform of 1928, when they adopted an adapted Latin script (i.e. what we use). This was believed to better accommodate the greater range of vowel sounds that Turkish has compared with Arabic. For that

matter, the Latin alphabet is poor for writing down English — we have something like twenty vowel sounds, but only five vowels. No wonder our spelling is complex. By contrast, the Latin alphabet works very well for Italian and Spanish. They have a smaller range of vowel sounds, which makes the spelling and pronunciation rules much easier.

The playwright George Bernard Shaw was well aware of the problem with English and funded a posthumous prize to go to the inventor of a new script that could better represent English. He stipulated that there should be at least forty letters, enabling all the spoken sounds we make (*phonemes*) to be represented with a single letter. So sounds like 'th', 'sh', 'ch', 'oo', 'aw' could all have their own letter. The competition was won by Ronald Kingsley Read, and his alphabet became known as Shavian, or the Shaw alphabet. It looks like this:

#### لا لاالكردا بدلك كه 6 بحالات 10 أما أما أنه لااكبدي.

(This reads 'Shaw himself never saw the alphabet that would bear his name.')

The strengths and weaknesses of this alphabet are readily apparent. Once you know the alphabet, spelling can become uniform, predictable and sensible. The alphabet is genuinely appropriate for the sounds of the language we speak. There are no redundancies and we don't need capital letters. The letters are easy to form.

On the other hand, asking everyone to learn a new alphabet and reprint all the books would be a nightmare — worse than Turkey went through in 1928. And we are used to there being different spellings for words that sound the same — to, too and two, for example. Would we be confused? Also, regional accents would have regional spellings. Think how the word 'power' is two syllables in most accents, but one (*parr*) if you're from Northern Ireland. Or for most Americans 'sauce' rhymes with 'cross', not 'horse'. And finally — it would seem like this might help people with dyslexia. No such luck. Too many of the letters are rotations or reflections of other letters. Still, it's fascinating to think of what our language might look like in an alternate reality!

#### THEOLOGY CORNER



#### **Ethics**

Throughout the last year or more in these articles I have tried to distill some of the cornerstones of Christian theology — what we believe about God, and why. As much as what we believe is important to Christianity, our faith insists that this is worthless if it does not make us live and act better. Jesus constantly challenges us not simply to pay back the good we receive, but to do good to those who can never pay us back.

'What we do' is broadly speaking the realm of ethics — the moral principles that govern our behaviour and our conduct of any activity. Often this is simple — in any number of situations we know the right thing to do, and how to do it. Ethics gets interesting, though, when it is harder to work out what is the right course of action — when we are pitting one good against another, or balancing the good that an action may bring against the harm that may also arise.

Everyone, religious or otherwise, has ethics because we all believe there are principles of right and wrong. Most of the time, Christian ethics and general ethics will agree, too. Partly this is because Christianity has been a huge factor in shaping modern European culture, and partly because all Europeans, Christian or otherwise, have been shaped by a Greek and Roman heritage and our ethics and philosophy still bear these marks.

For centuries the foundations of Christian ethics have been thought of as a three-legged stool, in which the legs are Scripture (i.e. the Bible), tradition, and reason. More recently we have come to see the importance of experience in our ethics, too — a fourth leg on our three-legged stool!

So we begin with what the Bible says — because Christians believe that this is God's word to us. Is that easy and straightforward? No! The Bible is literature more than rules, and history more than a handbook to ethics. For this reason, we end up with histories of interpretation, which becomes tradition: trust that certain schools of thought have read this correctly. But still, we are not people of blind faith, and Christians should not 'take their brains out'. We take what we read, and use our reason too, just as everyone should, when thinking through ethical complexities.

We'll think more about the interplay of Scripture, tradition and reason, next time.



#### MIDDLETON WI NEWS

At our June meeting we welcomed Mark Mitchels to give us a talk on "The Suffolk Coastline". He began by saying our coastline is one of the least developed in the country. There are rivers running inland from the sea with few ways to get across them; therefore there is no major road that runs directly down along the coast. Over the centuries erosion and silting up have done much to change the geography of the coast.

There is room in this report for only some of his stories. Lowestoft's herring industry once employed 10,000 people, now it is all gone. Covehithe was once a port with a large fifteenth century church, the remains of which and the smaller seventeenth century church built inside it will with cliff erosion disappear into the sea within ten years. Southwold's cannons on Gun Hill were not from the Battle of Sole Bay (1672) but brought down much later from Scotland, and buried underground in WWII to prevent them from being targets for the Germans. In 1879 a <u>narrow-gauge railway</u> connecting Halesworth, Wenhaston, Blythburgh and Southwold was built, carrying a six-carriage train that went at only 6mph, eventually being replaced by a bus service in 1928. Blythburgh, near the church, was the site of the 654 Battle of Bulcamp between the East Anglians and the Mercians. Opposite the end at Orfordness is Orford where a castle was built in 1178, not to deter foreign invaders but to see off the Bigods of Framlingham. The final place Mark mentioned was Felixstowe, once a gentle Victorian sea bathing resort, transformed into one of the largest container ports in Europe. This was the vision of local businessman, George Tomline who in 1884 had brought the railway to Felixstowe and then established the port.



## PROJECT UPDATE

#### **AUGUST 2025**

#### Work across all Sizewell C sites continues to progress at pace.

Last month, Sizewell C announced plans to build a new post-16 college for its host town in Suffolk - a move that could transform higher education access in the area and ensure a long-term skills legacy for the region. The Further Education (FE) college will be delivered in partnership with Suffolk New College and will be an extension of their current local provision, known as 'On the Coast'. It will be a permanent high-quality post-16 education facility for Leiston. which will deliver comprehensive, multisite education and training. Further details regarding location and planning requirements will be outlined shortly. For further information visit sizewellc.com/news.

Construction of the northern section of the temporary sea defence has started with the first sheet piles being installed. The works will take place within the Sizewell C fence line and the public footpath will remain open. We apologise for any noise disturbance which we will endeavour to keep to a minimum. Works will soon commence on installing a temporary outfall on the beach. This work will be for a short duration and within a fenced compound.

Site preparation, including construction compounds and welfare facilities, ecology and archaeology mitigations, continues at our Northern Park and Ride in Darsham.

Construction of the roundabout next to the
A12 and Willow Marsh Lane has started. To aid
road safety for all road users a 30 mph speed
limit on the A12 is planned between the A144
and the Darsham level crossing.

Similarly in Wickham Market work will conclude this summer. As areas become clear of archaeology work, construction will begin in a phased manner.

From the week commencing 7th July, track works will start along the Leiston branch line. Once this phase is complete, there will new track and ballast laying.

The works will be carried out by engineering trains and specialist tracklaying plant including along the track. The work can be noisy and create dust, however we will have dust suppression in place to minimise the impact. Working hours will be from approximately 07:00 to 19:00.

Our forums are a way for local people to hear about key issues related to the construction of Sizewell C. All forums run from 18:00 to 20:30 (arrival from 18:00).

#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR MP

In villages across the Yoxmere area, I know many residents are worried about two very practical issues: road safety around our schools, and the lack of reliable local bus services. These concerns come up time and again when I meet with constitutents.

One of the most immediate concerns is the safety of our children on the way to and from school. Working with primary schools in the constituency, I've launched a Parliamentary petition calling for a tailored road safety plan for every primary school in the constituency. That means looking carefully at local speed limits, crossings, pavement access and visibility - all informed by the people who know these roads best.

Separately, I've also just launched an online survey on local bus services. I know how difficult it can be in rural and coastal communities when bus routes are cut, services become unreliable, or timetables no longer reflect real life. Whether you still use the bus, used to, or want to but cannot - I would be really grateful if you could take a few minutes to share your experience. The more responses I gather, the stronger the case I can make for improvements to our bus services – and I'm keen that we shape the solutions together. #### TURTLE DOVES AT SUNRISE

It's sunrise on a chilly May morning. I get rather wearily out of my car, and instantly hear the delightful 'tur-turr' of a turtle dove, perching on the telephone wires nearby. All fatigue lifts immediately, and suddenly the morning is golden and magical! I am setting out on a farm survey, plotting all farmland birds onto a map, in order to map their territories later in the season. It will take me at least three hours, and I'll be drenched in dew from the thighs down, but that sound has made it all worthwhile...

I am the new Community Projects Officer for Operation Turtle Dove in Suffolk. This is a collaboration between the RSPB, Natural England, Pensthorpe Conservation Trust and Fair to Nature. The RSPB works internationally for the conservation of the Turtle Dove. They have been instrumental in the total ban on hunting Turtle Doves in France, Spain and Portugal over the last four years, and Operation Turtle Dove also works with landowners in England to improve habitat and feeding conditions for the birds.

My particular role is to assist smaller landowners and community groups to do what they can for Turtle Doves, particularly in areas where they have been known to breed in the past. After the four-year ban on hunting, the numbers of the Western European Flyway Population have begun to bounce back – over 30% in the first three years of the ban. The turtle doves which arrive on our shores are part of this population, wintering in west Africa.


When they arrive, what they need is actually quite simple, but not always common. Thick, scrubby, thorny hedges or thickets to nest in, easily accessible water, and seed. Studies have shown that seed is often the limiting factor, as farming methods now often don't leave a lot of space for the sort of arable 'weeds' that provide the seed that the doves need.

We have advisers who work with farmers and are familiar with the agrienvironment schemes which can enable the work.

So, if you have Turtle Doves on your land, or have had in the recent past, then please get in touch!

It is a free service, and I can visit to see how we may be able to optimise your patch for Turtle Doves and other wildlife... Also, if you hear or see a Turtle Dove, please submit your sighting to BirdTrack (<a href="www.BTO.org">www.BTO.org</a>).


