

### RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS



When I was a kid I had a View-Master — a toy like a pair of binoculars, for looking at 3D pictures held on discs. A button on the top right, like the shutter of a camera, rotated the disc to a new pair of images — seven per disc. Maybe you had one too? They were around for years.

I didn't have many 'reels' for it — but I still enjoyed the ones that came with it. There was a general set of pictures that often

deliberately showed off their stereoscopic effects, and another set from an American TV series called *Daktari*.

The general pictures included a flower that seemed to burst forward out of the frame towards the viewer, and a park in spring, full of daffodils. I came back to these again and again. Where was that park? Who walked in that park? What was the rest of it like? No matter what the weather was like on that day, or what season it was, it was always a nice day in spring when I put that picture in the View-Master.

I've mentioned before that I don't easily notice what is right in front of me. But a month ago, on Easter Sunday, even I noticed all the beautiful flowers in church. I went to five out of the eight churches over a few days and in each deliberately took a moment to look.

Windows and pedestals were bursting with colour — daffodils and tulips naturally, but much more besides (sorry — I can't name all I saw) all beautifully cut and arranged. After the bleakness of Lent, each church was glorious. So this is my chance to say 'thank you'.

I don't know how many of you worked in each church, but thank you. Each arrangement in each church was wonderful — God's beauty selected, cut and arranged with artistry. It took you time, thought and care. Not every person who contributed was a regular member of the congregation — thank you to you especially. In one of the churches I saw a fabulous Easter garden in miniature, with empty cross and empty tomb — I cannot imagine how long that took to prepare, but it was fabulous. I'm sure there was much that I missed along the way.

I love that churches can be the venue for such talent and skill. As summer proceeds there will be flower festivals in a number of the churches (look out for details), and there will also be concerts, besides being open during daylight hours simply for you to enjoy a quiet prayerful space, and the beauty of the buildings themselves. Do come, and see what hidden talents your neighbours possess!

### THEOLOGY CORNER



### Theology as an Analysis of Story

What is God like? Is God all powerful? Why is there evil in the world?

I have spent the last year or so in this column discussing the Bible, and how to read it intelligently and how to get the most out of it. Having done this, in simple overview from the beginning to the end, it follows that we might consider the discussion of God that came about in the earliest chapters of Christianity, and which is still ongoing. This discussion is theology in its widest terms —

always rooted in the Bible, but analysing and asking lots of questions, such as the ones above.

Often there is no conclusive answer to the questions we ask. Theology is not maths. But on the other hand, there can be consensus, which may indicate we're on solid ground.

Why ask such questions if we're not sure of the answers? Perhaps simply for the same reasons you ask such questions as 'Why am I here?' or 'Is this love?' or 'What does it all mean?' — because life is full of deep questions, which give meaning and shape to our lives. Theology and philosophy are often very closely related — sometimes in sync, sometimes used as weapons against each other.

I think theology needs to function first and foremost as a means of thinking about the story we find ourselves in.

Think of your own story: you were born at a very early age, to certain parents, in some place and you grew up somewhere; you had friends, you went to school and discovered your gifts. Did you meet the person of your dreams? Did you get married? Was there a 'sliding doors' moment that changed your direction in life dramatically? How did your character affect your story? How did choice or chance or circumstance act on your story? Whatever the answer, your story is an interesting one.

But it is also woven into a larger story. You are part of the story of your parents, and the story of your children if you have them - or your siblings, if you're not an only child. Are you the great romance of your partner's life? Your story is part of a much larger weave of interconnected stories.

Think how we might analyse a story if we were studying English literature. If we were studying *Hamlet* we might pay attention to the beginning of the story (Ghost

of dead king tells his son, Hamlet, to avenge his murder by Claudius, his brother, now on the throne). We might look at Hamlet's character — diffident, questioning, overwrought, intelligent. We might look at the ending — yes, Hamlet does avenge his father, but a lot worse happens, proving that Hamlet's anxiety about the idea of vengeance was well founded. Asking such questions as this, we might then say we understand the play and what it means, or what Shakespeare was trying to say.

We might do the same sort of analysis with the Bible — what does the beginning tell us? Is it trying to be literal or metaphorical? What does the book think its great themes are? Do we agree? Who is this central character, the Lord God? And who is Jesus? What does the cross mean? And the resurrection? Is it true?

Ask these sorts of questions and we are surely seeking both the meaning of the Bible, but also (perhaps) asking some of the most important questions. We are also doing theology in the process.

Theology is a more abstract process than reading a story. It is that next level up. You might talk of a ladder of abstraction — at the bottom of the ladder are the earthy details of everyday life — eating food, working, paying bills. At the top of the ladder are the matters that are close to universal — life and death, love, goodness and evil - that sort of thing. Theology goes up the ladder of abstraction in search of universal principles, but does so in order to go back down the ladder and do life in a new way, because of what we have learnt.

Curiously, while other religions also have theology, Christianity puts the most energy into it, and sets most store by it. Judaism, from which Christianity was born, clearly shares the same theological roots. But Judaism puts more weight on doing the right thing in the right way — keeping kosher, keeping the sabbath and the festivals. Christianity has no food rules, no requirement to pray a certain number of times a day, no obligation to take communion at any particular interval. And as such, if Christian identity does not rest on *what you do*, it must rest more heavily on *what you believe*. That's not to say that through the centuries there haven't been Christian attempts to codify *what you ought to do*, but Jesus spent more time making God known than teaching us rites or practices.

Next month we'll start to ask some of those questions that the Bible suggests we ask — beginning with 'What can we say about God?'



Our first participants in the Birdsong and Breakfast Walks were treated to a chorus of wildlife, and our first two Big Breakfasts on a Sunday were a wonderful cooked feast! In terms of other happenings, on the conservation front as mentioned previously, all the major works on site are finished, but we are starting to gain a picture of the state of nature here thanks to the surveys that our ranger is undertaking, and whether the milder winter meant more of the vulnerable species on site survived to the spring. Looking at what's on and coming up, we've got our Dartford Warbler walk (14th) and Birdsong and Breakfast Walk (8th) continuing, plus our first Nightjar Walk (30th). The Nightjar Walk in particular is a fascinating wander in search of one of Britain's most elusive and bizarre birds, a sight not to be missed! More details

attend school in Halesworth where a teacher inspired her to write poetry. After leaving school she lived in Mendham in an old railway carriage on a watermeadow while working and educating herself. Eventually she took a degree in English and Drama at Goldsmith's. She returned to Suffolk to work and write and now lives in Halesworth with her husband and 3 children. Between working and raising children she wrote stories and books that she submitted to publishers and various competitions over the years. Eventually after 10 years, a book sent to a Children's Novel Competition at Mslexia Magazine was long listed for a prize and it caught the attention of an agent and editor at Foyles. They gave her a month to rewrite, redraft the book and it was published as Fenn Halflin and the Fear Zero. It is a dystopian novel set in a future landscape that is almost completely flooded. A good-versusevil adventure story of a seaborn boy trying to escape from the land grabbing Terra Firma villains. Francesca was inspired by childhood memories of an old fishing smack the "Ionia" stranded in the mud at Slaughden in Aldeburgh, by stories of the "boat people", and by the Maunsell Forts off the Kent coast. Getting books published can be a matter of a manuscript being rewritten many numerous times until the editor is satisfied but the marketing people have the final say about offering a contract! As for the actual writing, Francesca says for her the plotting is hard but she is good at characters and that helps to get the story going. She also mentioned that she has a strong mental visualisation to help her story telling. We very much enjoyed this glimpse into an author's journey.





### 'The 1939 Register' - a talk by Dr Penny Walters, Monday 20th May, 2.30pm

The England and Wales 1939 Register was devised to produce forty million identity cards during World War II, when rationing was introduced. The information recorded provides a huge bridge between the last published census (1921) and 1939. People were more 'honest' in their information giving, providing exact date of birth, as they wanted their allocated rations.

From 1948, the Register was used as the National Health Service Register, and was updated until 1991, giving women's new surnames when they got married, handwritten above their name. The online UK 1939 Register is a relatively unknown, but very useful tool for genealogists.

The talk takes place in person and, for members only, on Zoom, at the Fromus Centre, Street Farm Road, Saxmundham, IP17 1AL (behind the library).
