#### RECTOR'S RAMBLE



Ten years ago, during the summer break between my two years at theological college, I took a placement — a week observing prison chaplaincy. So I and two college friends turned up at Littlehey prison on a Monday morning, having already gone through significant security checks to be accepted for the placement.

When we arrived, we were asked to show photo ID. My friends produced their driving licences. I could not. I hadn't brought a wallet! No photo ID: no admission — despite all the previous security checks I'd been through. That was that.

As I was told this, I raced through a whirl of emotions. Incredulity — "You can't be serious?!" Then bargaining: "Come on, you know I'm due to come, the others have photo ID, and they know who I am!" Soon there was internal blame and anger: "It's not my fault, no one said to bring photo ID!" Then shame mixed with depression — not only was *my* day over already, but I'd failed my friends who couldn't enter either, and it was my fault. Of course we returned the next day (with ID!) and I got over it — we all make mistakes.

As I reflected, I realised that I had experienced the 'five stages of grief' in miniature. These stages were first documented by Elizabeth Kübler-Ross, inspired by her work with terminally ill patients. Patients typically go through denial, anger, bargaining and depression before reaching acceptance of what is happening to them. But these emotions turn up when we suffer almost any loss, from lost keys to a lost sporting fixture to the loss of a close loved one — the difference being the depth and duration of these feelings. That said, nothing can compare to the death of a spouse, parent or child: our relationships are unique, shaped by the years of love experienced which are now gone.

To this end there will be an All Souls' service at 3pm on Saturday 1st November in St Peter's Westleton, to which all are welcome to remember those who have died.

We also have a monthly bereavement group that just might give you the support you need as you negotiate the five stages of grief. This meets in the foyer of Westleton Village Hall at 2pm on the first Monday of every month. The next meetings will be on Monday 3rd November, and then 1st December.

#### THEOLOGY CORNER



#### **Tradition**

Last month I said that the Bible could be a frustrating partner in developing good ethics — even Jesus' guidance is open to interpretation, and that interpretation was part of, and was shaped by, tradition.

Tradition sounds like the sort of fusty nonsense that Jesus was all about getting rid of. Time and again he conflicted with the pharisees about their traditions not being what God intended. So what do we mean by tradition, and why should we pay attention to it?

New Testament scholar Richard Hays describes tradition as "the church's time-honoured practices of worship, service and critical reflection". Which is to say that tradition is formed from all the prayer, study, sermons and debates that Christians have had through the centuries — including apostles, early church leaders, the "doctors" of the church such as Augustine and Jerome, the popes through the centuries, reformation titans such as Martin Luther, and more recent scholars such as Karl Barth, Jurgen Moltmann or Sam Wells. Why wouldn't we bear in mind their countless hours of reflection when making ethical decisions?

And what were those hours of reflection based on? Scripture. So ideally, tradition is founded on great scholarship, focused on the Bible.

But having said that, tradition can become so awe-inspiring that it becomes hard to think afresh. It is hard to break out of the grip of Augustine or Aquinas and have a new take. Thought becomes crystallised. Nonetheless the Reformation did enable a significant break and fresh theological thinking. And there have been other moments of significant breakage with tradition too. Some of these changes must be seen as revelation — God revealing himself in a new way. Abolitionism in the UK was inspired by Wilberforce and the Clapham sect. Generations before them had accepted slavery. But their faith inspired them to campaign against it.

Similarly, centuries of church tradition had interpreted some lines of St Paul as indicating that women could have no place in church leadership. That changed on 12th March 1994 with the ordination of the first women to priesthood in the UK. Tradition, it seemed, could be overturned. It became possible to see that Paul might have been misunderstood and read out of context — although the appointment of Bishop Sarah Mullally as the next Archbishop of Canterbury has further stoked the divisions within the worldwide Anglican church — sadly Christians do not all think and feel the same way!

This same process is also happening with the church's views on homosexuality. While some maintain their traditional views, others are looking again at the context of Biblical statements on the subject, and finding room for different views. The process is slow due to the hugeness of the worldwide church but it is real, and entered into with quite as much prayer, scholarship and debate as previous traditions.



Reiko Fujisawa fuses the sensibilities of a musician raised in the Far East who trained in the West. She appears at prestigious venues and festivals all over the UK and overseas including Wigmore Hall, Purcell Room, King's Place, Stoller Hall, Brighton Festival and Hebden Bridge Piano Festival, and was a featured artist at the Japan 2001 Festival. Reiko has broadcast on BBC Radio 3 and her recordings include an acclaimed CD of music by Bach, Beethoven and Schubert, which The Arts Desk found "irresistible". Her recording of Bach's Goldberg Variations also received a glowing review from The Record Geijutsu, Japan's equivalent to The Gramophone, describing it as an "unpretentious, clean and refreshing performance with a refined dignity".

### Update on the "Middleton Oaks" and B1125/B1122 Junction Road Layout

Following the demonstration reported in last month's issue, another demonstration was organised to try to stop the road closure for 'vegetation clearance' due to start the week beginning 6th October .... and after more press interest and intervention by our MP Jenny Riddell-Carpenter, SZC issued a last-minute reprieve, agreeing to pause works, stating they have "instructed their contractors to revisit the road layout design". The press reported on a celebration (instead of demonstration) by locals expressing their delight under the mighty oaks!

So - at the time of writing, five out of the seven oaks within the DCO-approved boundary of works along the B1125 have definitely been saved, a great result - and getting SZC to pause works while detailed discussions now take place about the road layout issues which impact the remaining two oaks is a major success. Hopefully we'll have even more positive news to report next month.

Having gone on a chocolate making course in Paris in 2015 the owners decided to have a go at making their own in their domestic kitchen. Success! This led to setting up a small factory in Beccles where they also make gelato and pastries. A shop and cafe are attached and there are also make-your-own-chocolate

experiences available. Their cocoa beans are sourced directly from small farms and cooperatives from all over the tropical world. The beans arrive in sacks. They roast them at low temperatures, then crush them to separate shells from the nibs. The nibs are ground to make a liquid (flavours added then) and the liquid is then conched (rolled) to lower the acidity and to develop natural aromas. The chocolate is then tempered and finally moulded.

Julie brought along samples for us to try: 70% dark chocolate, milk chocolate and salted caramel milk chocolate. All have a high percentage of cocoa and all are delicious! Very little sugar is added in the making compared to a commercial product and no plastic is used in the packaging. Having sampled the chocolate, we had no hesitation in buying (at a nice discount) the chocolates Julie had brought to sell. Rita thanked Julie for letting us into the chocolate-making world.

#### PEASENHALL & SIBTON SWIFT GROUP SPRING/SUMMER 2025

It has been a very good first year for our group. We have concentrated on checking four locations within the villages where surveys/counts were carried out during this spring and summer.

The first swift was spotted at the Assembly Hall on 28th April (an early date). They are also one of the earliest migrant birds to leave, and we saw our last swifts on 31st July. Over this period, we had our special flag flying at Sibton Nursery (with kind permission of Mr Levett-Scrivener and Tess the manager).

Up to nine nests were occupied on the south-facing gable end of the Assembly Hall, on the top edge of the wall under the eaves. This season, no swifts were seen using the swift boxes that were specially constructed on the north and south side of the hall, but we are hopeful that they will be used in the future. Up to twenty-six birds were seen flying in the area.

Trust Farm on Mill Road continues to be a popular place to see swifts and house martins during the season. Up to three swift nests were recorded under tiles on the front of the building and up to ten swifts were seen flying here.

The area near the Methodist Chapel was another popular area. Three were seen nesting under tiles on adjacent cottages, plus one nest box was occupied. An adjacent neighbour also reported that two nest boxes were occupied by swifts at the back of their house for the first time, after the boxes have been there for several years.

Around Sibton Country Supplies and The White Horse was another popular area for the swifts. Up to ten swift nests under tiles were reported from several properties in the area and at least twenty-five swifts were seen in groups performing their wonderful flying display.

Swifts are known for particularly liking old roofs, especially pantiled with spaces under the tiles. Our group are also encouraging swift nest boxes to be erected on suitable buildings and the use of swift bricks with built-in holes when repairs are carried out or new houses built. There is potential for more boxes to be erected at suitable locations around the villages, so if you are interested please contact me by emailing Martyn at <a href="mailto:swangallop@phonecoop.coop">swangallop@phonecoop.coop</a> or on 07501 088546. We have a number of boxes available for a donation of £25 to Suffolk Wildlife Trust.

I must thank the nine members from our community who supported the setting up of the Swift Group and our first successful summer season. If you are interested in joining the group, please contact me as above.



Thank you to everyone who attended the meeting to discuss the future of the White Horse. In case you were unable to attend, the slides presented during the meeting are available on the PC website, and a form is available in the shop to commit to actions to prevent the possible closure of the pub.

Following two demonstrations and press coverage, Sizewell C has decided not to fell five oak trees on the B1125 south of Middleton and is reviewing its plans for the extension of the B1125 to the planned Sizewell Link Road along with the need to fell two more oak trees. (More about this on Page 16.)

The Planning Inspectorate examination of the Sealink project will begin on 5th November. Westleton PC will present its concerns about the additional traffic and the destruction of the local environment resulting from the cable trenching and the construction of large industrial buildings completely disproportionate to the environment. We will further stress concerns about the impacts of the project on our residents and their quality of life, and about the damage to the tourism industry.

As a reminder: home owners need to apply to ESDC for permission to do any tree work in the conservation area. Even removal of a dead or potentially unsafe tree must be notified to the Council. ### PROJECT UPDATE

#### **NOVEMBER 2025**

### Welcome to the latest round up of construction activity at Sizewell C.

Sizewell C is now working in multiple areas across East Suffolk whilst we build infrastructure such as park and ride facilities and rail extensions to transport our workers and freight. We are very sorry for the impact this work is having on local journeys. Our teams are working hard to get the new infrastructure built as quickly and safely as possible but we acknowledge that some work, such as the major works to build a new road to by pass two villages on the A12, will take up to two years before it is finished.

As our work ramps up we have introduced a weekly summary of road diversions and closures that can be found on the **Sizewell C Works Tracker** - Track SZC Projects & Get Alerts for New Activities. The update will be added to the Sizewell C social media feeds, our SMS and email alerts.

The traffic lights on the A12 at Marlesford will be lifted and moved off the carriageway by the time of publication. We are reviewing the cones along the A12 and will reduce the number required as much as possible, the lay-by works are due to be completed in early December, however we are making good progress and hope to complete the

work earlier than projected. As we progress the roundabouts at Friday Street and Yoxford, careful traffic management will still be required.

We are working hard to reduce HGV and Sizewell C related traffic, we are reducing the number of office-based workers coming into Leiston as we relocate staff to the Orwell Logistics Park site where 300 desks are available. The office at Orwell will also become the default base for external meetings. We are also opening the Northern Park and Ride in phases with the first partial opening from early November, with a bus service running from the Park and Ride to site. Bus services are also now running from Saxmundham train station as we continue to promote the use of train and public transport.

As part of our commitment to bring 60 per cent of our materials by sea and rail, we are prioritising the construction of the new rail line that will take our materials to our temporary construction area, with the aim to have trains running in the first half of 2026. The works will involve building level crossings across Buckleswood Road and the B1122 (Abbey Road) in Leiston, we have built a temporary diversion road to ensure that traffic disruption is minimised.
